Seamon shows us that movies rarely get amnesia right, often using strategically timed blows to the protagonist's head as a way to turn memory off and then on again (as in *Desperately Seeking Susan*). Finally, he uses movies including *On Golden Pond* and *Amour* to describe the memory loss that often accompanies aging, while highlighting effective ways to maintain memory function.
